### Thomas E. Knauff

Nearing the end of his 40-year career in propane, industry leader witnesses changes that spur his increasing involvement

ith aspirations of becoming an English teacher, Tom Knauff took a different path and eventually made his way to propane with a job at Ferrellgas, where he began a lifelong stay in the industry.

Since joining Ferrellgas in 1983, Knauff has spent more than 40 years working in the industry in various capacities, forging some of the biggest and most dynamic companies. Over those 40 years, he has overseen more than 100 acquisitions.



When Knauff joined Ferrellgas, the company had 18 retail locations. During his tenure, its retail side grew dramatically. With the leveraged buyout of Buckeye Gas Products in 1986, Ferrellgas became the third-largest propane retailer in the country. By the time he left Ferrellgas, the company was operating 500 retail locations, with Knauff responsible for 150 of them.

After leaving Ferrellgas, Knauff co-founded Propane Continental with funding from Illinois-based Allstate Insurance Co., leading him to Chicago. Propane Continental acquired 36 businesses before being acquired by Cornerstone Propane.

Knauff also co-founded Jordan Knauff & Co., an investment banking firm, before cosponsoring Liberty Propane, which acquired 26 companies before it was acquired in 2009.

With the acquisition of Linden's Propane in 2012, Knauff founded EDP.

Thirteen years and more than 50 acquisitions later, EDP now has 58 outlets. Last year, the company supplied 118 million gallons of propane to customers in 24 states.

Knauff is known for his active leadership as part of the National Propane Gas Association executive committee and board of directors. In this service, Knauff has fought against existential threats to the industry like the electrify-everything initiative and the anti-fossil fuels movement. He's also known for his genuine care and mentorship of others.

Now, Knauff, 75, nears the end of his propane career with retirement on the horizon, but he plans on keeping busy in other ways, chiefly in spending time with his family.

### **Rita Pecilunas**

Versatile marketing and communications professional elevates propane industry through innovative projects, efforts behind the scenes

or more than 30 years, Rita Pecilunas has worked to position the propane industry for success. With a background in event planning, marketing and communications, and journalism, she became accustomed to undertaking important programs or projects for the industry when few others were willing to take them on. In her own words, she's typically the "behind-the-scenes gal."



A 2025 Hall of Fame inductee, Pecilunas is now front and center, as her propane peers recognize what her varied roles and responsibilities have meant to the industry at critical moments in its history.

Pecilunas served as vice president of marketing and member services for the National Propane Gas Association (NPGA), where for 10 years she helped to shape its marketing strategies, campaigns and financial growth plans. She helped to launch Pinnacle 2000, the industry's first national educational conference, which ran from 1995 to 2006, and revitalize the Southeastern Convention. Pecilunas led the industry's centennial celebration that culminated in 2012's acclaimed "Clean Air Parade" and helped position propane as a relevant, reliable and clean-burning fuel. She also has served as a facilitator for the NPGA Benchmarking Council.

At NPGA, she went on to manage three departments and, at 29, earned the distinction of being the first woman to serve as a vice president in the association.

Pecilunas also managed projects for the Propane Education & Research Council (PERC) and what is now known as the World Liquid Gas Association.

In her capacity with PERC, she helped to develop and roll out the "Marketer Technology Training" initiative that educated marketers about ways to promote the safe and efficient use of propane in their communities and traveled the nation teaching customer service and sales training to customer service representatives as part of the program.

In 2019, Pecilunas joined tank monitoring provider Otodata to help educate propane marketers about the role technology can play in their operations.

### **Walter Smith**

Conversation at 1991 trade show changes engineer's career, leads to sought-after solution for LPG industry

alter Smith turned a conversation with a propane industry colleague into an idea for a new product. That idea – sparked at the 1991
Western Propane Trade Show & Convention in Palm Springs, California – led to the formation of a new company as well.



An engineer, Smith formed Full-Circle later that year after engaging in a discussion with the colleague about the problem of hoses twisting during propane delivery. The colleague saw a

need for a UL-listed, hose-end swivel designed for propane, and he had asked Smith for a solution.

Hesitant at first during the conversation, Smith began to see the possibilities of developing a listed swivel for the industry. That night in his hotel room, he began to sketch product designs on hotel stationary. About a week later, he was back in his office, on track to develop a prototype for testing.

Smith calls the events in Palm Springs "a perfect storm" that led him to envision and ultimately design the first UL-listed, hose-end swivel for the propane industry. In fact, Full-Circle would develop a series of listed hose-end and hose-reel swivels (various SMAC and JO models). The hose-end swivel allowed for a 360-degree rotation of the filler valve at the end of a delivery hose, and it became a standardized piece of equipment on bobtails in North America and in other markets around the world.

Prior to his work on the swivels, Smith was fueling the family's legacy with pumps. His grandfather founded Smith Precision Products (Smith Pumps) in 1938, and his father developed many of the company's original products. Smith served as president and CEO of Smith Pumps from 1986-2022 and designed several of its products.

Smith, 72, a quiet and humble leader for his company and the industry, retired in 2022 but still works as a consultant for both Smith Pumps and Full-Circle. His son, C.J., is now the fourth-generation president of the companies.

### **Ken Taylor**

Propane industry veteran develops lifetime commitment to safety with a focus on emergency response

chance encounter during high school changed the trajectory of Ken Taylor's life and, in doing so, changed the state of safety training in the propane industry.

Taylor's career began with a chance meeting at a gas station when a man in a Mercedes asked him, "What do you want to do with your life?" That fateful conversation led to a job installing and troubleshooting industrial propane ovens used in textile manufacturing. This opportunity sparked a lifelong dedication to propane safety and industry advancement.



Forty-five years later, his contributions to safety, training and mentorship have earned Taylor a place in the *LP Gas* Hall of Fame.

Taylor was vice president of White Mountain Oil & Propane in North Conway, New Hampshire, for over 20 years. At White Mountain, Taylor oversaw safety, delivery, service and repairs.

But his contributions extend far beyond his work with White Mountain Oil & Propane. As a member of the Propane Gas Association of New England, he played a crucial role in shaping safety initiatives.

Taylor helped create and develop the Propane Emergency Response Program, and he spearheaded the development of the well-known guidebook "Propane Emergencies."

Taylor also served on a number of committees, from the New Hampshire Governor's Advisory Council on Emergency Preparedness to National Propane Gas Association safety and transportation committees.

Taylor's influence was instrumental in establishing the first dedicated propane training facility at the Massachusetts Fire Academy. He continues to participate in fire training programs in New England, serving as a mentor to new instructors and volunteers.

It's this commitment to mentorship that gives Taylor confidence for the future of the propane industry. With a new generation of professionals stepping up, Taylor knows that his work will continue to influence industry standards and practices for years to come.




